

Lifeguard

DEFINITION

Under close supervision, an emergency service worker who is responsible for overseeing the safety of the patrons of the Durant City Pool.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

(Essential functions, as defined under the Americans with Disabilities Act, may include the following tasks, knowledge, skills and other characteristics. This list of tasks is ILLUSTRATIVE ONLY, and is not a comprehensive listing of all functions and tasks performed by positions in this class.) Incumbents in this class may not be required to perform all duties listed and may be required to perform additional, position-related duties.

TASKS

Lifeguarding at the City Pool; maintains a clean and safe environment for pool patrons; teach pool patrons open and private swim lessons.

Performs other duties as assigned or required.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND OTHER CHARACTERISTICS

Knowledge of Lifeguarding techniques and procedures.

Knowledge of Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and First Aid procedures.

Knowledge of safety practices applicable to working in a pool area.

Certified in Lifeguarding

Certified in performing CPR and First Aid

Skills in establishing and maintaining a positive working relationships.

WORK ENVIRONMENT AND PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

Work is performed in indoor and outdoor environment. Work may require frequent standing, walking, sitting, bending, swimming and lifting up to 50 pounds. May be exposed to repetitive motion, extreme temperatures and weather, hazardous chemicals, infectious diseases, water and airborne pathogens.

QUALIFICATIONS

16 years of age or older. Must possess at the time of application and maintain valid Lifeguard, CPR and First Aid Certifications. Water and Safety Instructor a plus. Must be able to work weekends and holidays.
