



THE CITY OF DURANT

CITY PROJECTS UPDATE 10/14/2022

University Blvd

- A motion carried during a Special City Council Meeting (9/16/22) recommending that City Administration work through the Surety (bonding company) to complete the project
 - City Administration was in agreement and sent notice to the Surety requesting they step in, assisting with completion of the project
- Two-way traffic restored (10/10/22) from Westside Drive to University Place
- City officials met with representatives of the Surety (10/13/22) onsite to review the condition/progress of the construction project. They have requested additional information from Wall Engineering to be submitted by close of business Monday, 10/17/22.

Streets

- Striping is complete on specified roadways
- Main Street Improvement to be bid this fall

Water/Line Maintenance

- Pipeline Analysis Sewer Collection System Study continuing currently 82% complete

Water Plant

- First of three filter underdrains have been installed
 - Demolishing the second of the three filter's underdrain to be replaced
- 35% of the Scada has been installed and is online

Durant Regional Airport

- Airport Layout Plan development in progress
- Additional parking 75% complete
- Taxiway lighting project to begin November
- Plans for new AWOS system in the works for 2023

Durant Emergency Management Doppler Radar

- Anticipated Installation Date Range – Nov. 28 – Dec. 9
- Spare parts package will arrive, in part, near installation date, the rest in 2023
- Lynx software package expected to arrive Dec. 5 - 9
- Water tower climate controlled enclosure expected soon
- Staff training scheduled for December

Parks and Recreation

- Lake Durant Disc Golf Course and RV Pad waterlines upgrades complete
- New Playground to be installed at Keithley Park
- Unity Monument
 - Platform cement poured, statue is in place
 - Feathers expected to be added next week
 - Benches, lighting and sidewalk materials purchased for future installation
- Moving Dixon Durant Statue from Market Square to City Hall
 - Platform cement poured
 - Installation expected at City Hall next week
